The International Alliance of Theatrical Stage Employees (IATSE) and the Alliance of Motion Picture and Television Producers (AMPTP) completed the first week of Basic Agreement General Negotiations on Friday.

Talks with employers on the Basic Agreement restarted on April 29 and are scheduled to remain ongoing through May 16.


Asian American and Pacific Islander Heritage Month

A Message from President Liz Shuler, AFL-CIO

- The beginning of May marks the start of Asian American and Pacific Islander (AAPI) Heritage Month, offering an opportunity for all of us to reflect on the significant contributions made by generations of AAPI workers to the U.S. labor movement. Despite facing centuries of racially discriminatory laws and continued exclusion from history textbooks, Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders have played a critical role in creating the workers' rights movement as we know it today.
- In the 1800s, as the sugar plantation era was beginning in Hawaii, modern labor struggle was also being forged. One of the islands' earliest recorded strikes was in 1841 when Native Hawaiian laborers walked off the job at a sugar cane plantation to protest inhumane working conditions.
- In the 1960s, Filipino American farmworkers in California organized strategic grape strikes and agitated alongside Latino agricultural laborers for higher wages and union representation.
- In 1982, Chinese immigrant women who worked in harsh conditions in New York City's Chinatown garment shops staged one of the neighborhood's largest protests to demand fair wages and better working conditions.
- And today, countless individual AAPI union members, as well as powerful organizations like the Asian Pacific American Labor Alliance (APALA), continue to carry the torch of this proud tradition of worker activism, boldly demanding racial justice and economic justice in our workplaces, courts and legislatures.
- The story of America's labor movement is a vibrant tapestry of so many identities, cultures and hopeful visions for the future. And threaded into that fabric are numerous stories of victories and sacrifices made by AAPI workers, adding to an ever-growing legacy of lasting, transformational change.


