In The Spotlight this week!

Not all MyUCLA Health Providers are fully covered by MPI



As a reminder, the UCLA app or MyChart app is designed for navigating UCLA's network of providers but is NOT affiliated with MPI's MP3 network. Not all UCLA

<u>providers are MP3 providers.</u> To remain in the MP3 network and receive the highest tier of coverage, a referral from an MP3 provider to another MP3 provider is required.

To repeat, not all UCLA providers are covered at 100% with a \$5 copay. For example, be careful when making an appointment for a flu shot as the provider may be outside of the MP3 network.


For LA residents, benefits are structured in three levels:

- MP3 Providers: Covered services are paid at 100%, minus a \$5 copay. Your primary care provider must be affiliated with MP3 and refer you out to other MP3 specialist or location for services. You can track your MP3 referrals at www.mpiphp.org as well as search specialist. You should ask your doctors to refer you only within this network of doctors or receive services at one of the legacy UCLA primary care clinics (formerly the UCLA-MPTF Health Centers) located throughout Los Angeles County.
- Anthem Blue Cross In-Network Providers: Covered at 90% of the contracted rate, with a \$30/\$15 copay and 10% patient responsibility.
- Out-of-Network Providers (not contracted with Anthem): Covered at 50% of the allowed amount, with a \$30/\$15 copay and full responsibility for the remaining billed amount.

If you were a recipient in the past, you are ineligible; this is a one-time award. Scholarship Award recipients will be notified in March 2026.


